#### "lesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life..." (John 11:25)


I recently bought a book written in Japanese titled, "The Easiest Guide to the Bible in the World." This book was written by two young lay persons in Japan and became quite popular. As I went through this book, one thing that really struck me was that how many Christian words and events we take for granted need to be explained to those who are not familiar with church culture.

Easter, for example, is one of them. Christmas is somewhat popular even in Japan, but Easter, on the other hand, is not even mentioned there. I myself didn't grow up celebrating Easter at home. I learned about Easter only because I attended Sunday school for a while. I was too young to be interested in the Bible, but on one Easter day, my


teacher gave us a card with a drawing (a smiling bird coming out of an egg) and on top of the card, it said, "I am the resurrection and the life". I didn't understand what that really meant as a child, but the verse as well as the image stayed with me for a long time.

Without us being aware of it, church culture can be too intimidating o those who are not part of it. The guide I bought helped me to realize we don't need sophisticated approaches to tell the world what we are doing at church. We just have to be ready to 'break down' what we do at church without feeling annoyed. I hope we get to reexamine a familiar word like "Easter" on this Easter and recall how we came to celebrate it. We will see, God may give us an opportunity to explain it to someone who is totally unfamiliar! ~ Pastor Yuki

## **Storytelling Workshop**

#### Revelations: How storytelling helps us see one another



On March 30, roughly 25 congregants from NSBC's English, Spanish and Karen language groups participated in a storytelling training workshop sponsored by the Young Adult Initiative and hosted at the Church. While most of us had seen each other before - at worship, at times between worship, or at coffee hour - many of us were still strangers. Storyteller and trainer **Tanya Lane** led us through a number of exercises designed to slowly peel away this strangeness, to show our true selves, and thus to be vulnerable to

each other. Our first exercise started safe and cheerful. We shared simple yet defining details of ourselves favorite foods or slight quirks. But we then began to share about our family life, and as we moved into this intimate space, there was a hush around the room. Without moving, we had become closer. This peeling away asked each of us to really invest in the space and the community we were creating.

The activity proceeded to an imagining of one's lifespan, from birth until this present moment, spaced along the length of the room. We were asked to place ourselves along this imaginary timeline at a moment of major change in our lives. We each paused, looking back at our lives and slowly

shuffled across the room to a spot corresponding to that moment in our lives. We again shuffled, responding to a new question: at what moment were you especially



brave in your lifetime? We continued to share stories that bridged into this year.

Just before lunch, we reflected on our connection to and participation in the North Shore Baptist community. Why is it that so few

neighbors even realize that North Shore Baptist Church exists? How do we properly explain ourselves not just against a more dominant, outspoken Christian identity but for a loving, caring and justice driven American Baptist presence?

After lunch we applied the questions and stories from throughout the day in a story crafting workshop. We created two concentric circles of people, face-to-face, inside to outside. Each person from the pair was given 90 seconds to tell a story about our connection to or growth within NSBC. The inner circle then shifted by one person so that we were still face-to-face, but with a new face. We were given only




60 seconds each this time. Again we told the stories and received feedback. We moved and repeated this story one last time, but weaving in a narrative of inspiration. How does NSBC give you inspiration and how does this story reflect or speak to that?



In telling this last story, we took a big step in forming answers to some of those questions that were raised over lunch. In the end, they did not need to be answered directly. They required us to tell our stories of life at NSBC and to continue asking the questions, finding and building new answers, and asking new questions about why we continue to make NSBC our home.

In just four hours, moments of meaning from 25 people across spans of life were shared. Many of us started as strangers, but left enriched with a fuller understanding of each other and ourselves. All this because we allowed ourselves be be seen.



## Holy Week 2019

As Holy Week approaches, with its climax in the Resurrection power of God's love in the world, North Shore is offering special observances and celebrations.

- **Palm Sunday** the Spanish language and English language congregations will gather together shortly before **10:00 a.m**. in the memorial garden courtyard (or the gym if the weather is bad) to sing Hosannas and process into worship, led by children and waving palms.
- **Good Friday** there will be two worship services, one in **English** (7:30 in the Sanctuary) and one in **Spanish** (7:00 pm in Howel Hall). Each will focus on the crucifixion as a revelation of God's love and of the promise of Liberation.

**Sunday - Easter worship**. The day will begin with Easter Breakfast at 8:15 am in Howel Hall, Then each congregation will celebrate in its own way, according to our regular schedule: Spanish Language - 9:30, English Language - 10:00, Japanese Language - 11:00, Karen Language - 12:30. Special music, songs and prayers of praise, resurrection preaching, lilies, all will combine to make North Shore a glorious tapestry of "Alleluia!" in many languages in one church! An Easter Egg Hunt for the children will take place after worship.
